Christopher Fellows was born in Ithaca, New York where he trained with Ithaca Ballet in his early years. He began intensive study in the Vaganova syllabus under the tutelage of Rafael Grigorian in 1991. He also attended The School of American Ballet on scholarship from 1993-1995. During his career, he danced principal roles in many ballets, including *Romeo & Juliet, Swan Lake, The Nutcracker, Dracula, Giselle, Carmina Burana, The Taming of the Shrew,* and *The Moor's Pavane.* He also had original works created on him by contemporary and classical choreographers such as Lee Wei Chao, Foye DuBose, Rafael

Grigorian, Michael Pink, Kathryn Posin, Margot Sappington, Thor Sutowski, Nelly Van Bommel and Petr Zahradnicek.

He retired from active performance in 2008 to pursue his lifelong passion for teaching ballet. Over the course of his career, he has taught for Alabama School of Fine Arts, Milwaukee Ballet School, Danceworks Milwaukee, Point Park University, Yanlai Dance Academy and Huntingdon Dance Academy. In August of 2016, he graduated summa cum laude from Point Park University with a Bachelor of Arts in ballet pedagogy. Mr. Fellows lives in Pittsburgh with his family.



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Community Outreach

The Pittsburgh Philharmonic is strongly committed to community outreach. In addition to our outdoor summer concerts, we also provide the following opportunities for young musicians and composers. Details regarding eligibility application, submission deadlines, and contact information can be found on our website: **pghphil.org**.

Summer Student Side-by-Side Program

High school instrumental students entering grades 8 – 12 are invited to audition for an opportunity to play side by side with the members of the Philharmonic for the entire summer season. Pittsburgh Philharmonic summer students work and play in a mentoring environment with experienced adult musicians.

Lorraine C. Lippert Young Artist Concerto Competition

We invite musicians 19 years old or younger performing on strings, brass, percussion, woodwinds, or harp to participate. The winner receives a \$300 scholarship and is invited to perform with the Philharmonic during its May concert.

Young Composers Contest

Each year, the Pittsburgh Philharmonic invites submissions of compositions from residents of the Greater Pittsburgh area. This is a unique opportunity for local composers aged 35 and under to have their work performed by a symphonic orchestra. The contest winner will have their piece performed at the Pittsburgh Philharmonic's May concert and will receive a \$300.00 prize.

Meet the Music Director

Daniel Nesta Curtis is an American conductor and educator noted for his adventurous programming and advocacy for underrepresented composers. Curtis joined the faculty of the School of Music at Carnegie Mellon University in 2012 as the department's Resident Conductor and the Artistic Director of the CMU Contemporary Ensemble. Curtis has conducted performances with the CMU Philharmonic, Chamber Orchestra, Baroque Ensemble, Percussion Ensemble, as well as several fully staged opera productions. Curtis has

been a frequent guest conductor of several other Pittsburgh-based ensembles including Alia Musica, Kamertōn, BrassRoots, Resonance Works, and Nat28. Originally from Key West, Florida, Curtis has conducted several orchestras in the Southeast including the Key West Pops Orchestra. Curtis received his BA from Amherst College (2008) and his MM in conducting from Carnegie Mellon University (2012) where he studied with Ronald Zollman and Robert Page.
